Physical Education Students of the Month



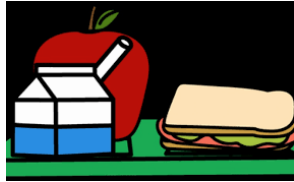

Nurse's Notes

TDAP IMMUNIZATION:

All Students entering the 6th Grade and are 11 years of age for the 2019-2020 school year are required to have a Tdap to be in school in September. Students who are not yet 11 years of age will be required to have their Tdap immunizations within 2 weeks after their 11th birthday.

Vision Problems are common in children.

There are many clues we can be aware of with the little ones:

- Eyes turning inward (crossing) or outward.
- Squinting
- Headaches
- Not doing as well in school as before
- Blurred or double vision
- Losing place while reading Avoiding close work
